
DALY GOES FOR 5 HITS & 6 RBI AS AMERICAN CLUBS TRENTON

PHILADELPHIANS BEAT BOTTOM-DWELLERS BY 15 TO STAY WITHIN 5 GAMES OF SHAMROCK

PHILADELPHIA (July 24, 1867) - American BC has a number of All-Stars in their ranks - Peter Boyce (2x), William Busby, Willie Davis (8x), & Werner Verstegen - but on Wednesday their star player was OF Frazer Daly as they pummeled last-place Trenton United at Glenwood Field.



Trenton United started the game off well enough, going up 6-1 thanks to a five-run attack in the 1st and another run in the 2nd. However, eleven runs on nine hits by American in the bottom of the 2nd put an end to any thoughts Trenton had of pulling an upset in Philadelphia, and from there the hosts kept piling on runs until they had 22 by the end of the 6th.

- B4: 2-Run Single past SS off E. Bryant (Run)
- B5: 2-Run Single b/w SS & 3B off E. Bryant
- B7: J. Olson enters as PH w/ the score 22-6 to AME
- TOTAL: 5/5, 2B, 3 R, 6 RBI, 103 GMSC

The fifteen-run win kept American five games behind Shamrock in the Coastal Championship with nine games to play. Meanwhile, Trenton United dropped to 23-38, three games out of 7th and likely to finish last for the second season in a row.
